Dear Congressman

In 1970, it was my honor to march from Macon to Atlanta, Georgia with the great leader, Hosea Williams, and 50 members of his Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) to oppose racism here in the US. Today, our brothers and sisters in Sudan need our support to oppose racism in their country. Although they have bravely confronted and deposed the genocidal President, al-Bashir, they remain under the yoke of his henchmen militia and the entrenched members of his former regime. The people face the resumption of the Arabist hegemony that has ruled Sudan since 1956, when the Anglo-Egyptian condominium turned it over to the Nile River Arabs. Decades of serial genocides by that rule has resulted in a death toll of almost 5 million non-Arab Blacks.

If the US appeases and engages with the present transitional government before it commits to civilian rule, peace, freedom and accountability, it is abetting the resumption of the same racist regime, and condemning the non-Arab African population.
